Quality of Education

- To ensure disciplinary knowledge is built and themes are connected within and across all subjects so pupils understand how the knowledge they acquire fits within wider frameworks of learning
- To ensure quality first teaching, along with carefully targeted additional support, enables all pupils, including SEND, disadvantaged and more able children to make rapid progress in writing and maths so any identified gaps are narrowed
- To further develop outstanding teaching in phonics, early reading and additional reading support so all pupils make good progress and any gaps are narrowed.

Behaviour and Attitudes

- To ensure the way behaviour is managed meets the needs of all pupils so adults and children are safe, happy and meet their full potential in learning
- To improve the attendance of vulnerable pupils so it is more closely aligned to that of non-vulnerable pupils

Personal Development

- To enable all children to further develop respect for our diverse society within and beyond school and begin to understand unconscious bias.
- To further develop the offer of extra-curricular clubs and curriculum enrichment so it is cohesively planned and accessible to all pupils including disadvantaged

Leadership and management

- To continue to work effectively with the local authority to introduce nursery provision at Wivelsfield School.
- To continue to look after the well-being of all staff so everyone feels valued and can work together collaboratively
